

ORDER NO ____/2020
OF DIRECTOR OF THE MUSEUM OF THE SECOND WORLD WAR IN GDAŃSK
of __.05.2020

**on special safety measures at the Museum of the Second World War in Gdańsk
in connection with the COVID-19 epidemic**

§ 1. General provisions.

1. In connection with the COVID-19 epidemic, special measures are introduced at the Museum of the Second World War in Gdańsk, hereinafter referred to as "the Museum".
2. All visitors to the Museum are obliged to comply with this order.
3. The Museum Security Department and security staff are responsible for enforcing the provisions of this order.
4. A Museum Security Officer has the right, pursuant to the rights endowed in the Act of 22 August 1997 on the Protection of People and Property, to intervene, refuse access to and remove from the Museum building and the Exhibitions of the Museum those who do not comply with this order and the Museum safety rules.
5. The Security Department is responsible for monitoring and current replenishment of the disinfectant containers in the Museum.

§ 2. Rules of visitors' stay in the Museum.

1. Every visitor entering the Museum and entering the garage hall is obliged to disinfect hands with disinfectant immediately.
2. Containers with disinfectant are located at the entrances to the Museum, at the ticket office, information desk, museum shop, in the garage hall, at exhibitions and by the toilets in the Museum building.
3. Visitors may be asked to undergo the body temperature measurement using a non-contact thermometer. In case of refusal to undergo the measurement, and if after the examination it is found that the body temperature equals or exceeds 37 degrees Celsius, these persons are obliged to leave the Museum building immediately.
4. Visitors are obliged to move in a way that ensures that a spatial distance of at least 2 m is maintained, unless this distance is not possible due to the care of a child up to the age of 13, a person with a disability certificate, a person with a certificate of disability degree, a person with a certificate of special education or a person who cannot move on their own due to their health condition. The order to maintain the spatial distance does not apply to persons living together or maintaining a common household.
5. Children up to 13 years of age have access to the Museum only under the care of a person exercising parental authority, legal guardian or other adult.
6. Visitors are obliged to cover their mouth and nose with clothing or its parts, mask, half-mask or protective helmet, subject to paragraph 7.
7. The obligation to cover mouth and nose shall not apply:
 - 1) to children under 4 years of age,
 - 2) to persons who cannot cover their mouth or nose because of their state of health, general developmental disorders, mental disorders, moderate, severe or profound intellectual disabilities, or persons with difficulty in covering or revealing their mouth or

nose on their own; the presentation of a judgment or certificate to that effect is not required.

8. The mouth and nose may be uncovered:
 - 1) when it is necessary to identify or verify the identity of the person concerned,
 - 2) in connection with the provision of services to the person concerned, if this is necessary for the provision of those services,
 - 3) in order to communicate with a deaf and/or mute person.
9. It is recommended that visitors entering the main exhibition, temporary exhibition room, children's exhibition wear disposable gloves and wear them throughout the entire tour of the exhibition.
10. Persons staying in the Museum store are obliged to wear disposable gloves during their stay in the store.
11. It is recommended that visitors in the garage area as well as in the main hall do not use passenger lifts. They are dedicated to the disabled, elderly people and children under 2 years old and their carers.
12. The cloakroom is closed until further notice. Self-service lockers are available for a deposit of PLN 2.
13. It is recommended to leave the outer covers and luggage in the car or in the self-service lockers available to the public.
14. Individual tours are obligatory, without a guide. Group tours are not possible.
15. The use of audio guides and guide services is not possible until further notice.
16. The number of visitors is limited to 1 person per 15m².

§ 3. Sale of tickets.

1. The recommended form of purchase of admission tickets to the exhibitions is the Internet.
2. Tickets can be purchased up to 15 minutes before the designated time of entry to the exhibition.
3. It is not necessary to print out the entrance tickets, they can be displayed on a mobile device.
4. The preferred form of payment at the Museum ticket offices is non-cash payment.
5. Persons queuing at the ticket office, information desk, museum store are obliged to keep 2 meters distance from each other.
6. Persons queuing at the ticket office, information desk, museum store are obliged to keep one meter distance from the staff.

§ 4. Temporary restrictions on access to facilities and tour areas.

1. There is a possibility of temporary restrictions on access of visitors to facilities with multimedia presentations and specific tour zones (parts of the exhibition, exhibition halls).
2. Information about temporary shutdown will be given on the Museum website.
3. Temporary shutdown does not constitute the basis for reimbursement of all or part of the ticket paid by the visitor.

§ 5. Final provisions.

1. Purchase of a ticket to the Museum constitutes acceptance of this order.
2. To the extent not regulated by this order, the Regulations in force in the Museum, in particular the Visitors' Regulations, apply.
3. The Order comes into force on the day of execution.
